### MAINTENANCE MANUAL

The Miller is a proud example of traditional craftsmanship, made by a saddlemaker from the highest quality, 5 mm thick South German leather. Tanned over the course of 8 to 12 weeks, the leather is then dyed with metal-free pigments to produce our black, cognac, and brown options. The natural option is not dyed, so it will darken with age—it is also squeakier when used than the dyed options. All leathers are finished with natural waxes and oils.

#### Leather Care

Ensure that your Miller Chair or Ottoman has a long life by following these recommendations:

#### Routine Care

- Dust regularly with a clean, dry cloth of cotton or wool. Never use a more abrasive cloth, as it could damage your leather.
- To keep the leather from drying out, use a soft cloth to apply a natural, color-free leather cream once a year. If the leather is exposed to direct sunlight, apply the cream twice a year.

#### Scratch Removal

- Gently rub small marks with a soft cloth made of cotton or wool.
- For best results, begin with the scratch itself and then continue to rub the entire leather surface.

#### Stain Removal

- Wipe excess stain immediately with a clean cloth or sponge. Then let the leather air-dry. (Never use heat to dry leather.)
- Butter, grease, or oil stains will dissipate into leather. For other stains, if additional cleaning is necessary, dampen a soft cloth with mild soap and lukewarm water and gently wipe down the leather. Again, do not spot clean. Wipe the entire surface.
- Dry with a clean, soft cloth.
- If the stain remains, contact a professional cleaner.

**Remember that leather's color naturally deepens as it ages. Never use saddle soap, cleaning solvents, oils, furniture polishes, varnishes, abrasive cleaners, detergents, or ammonia. These products will ruin the finish on your leather, making it sticky or cracked.**
